the long run.

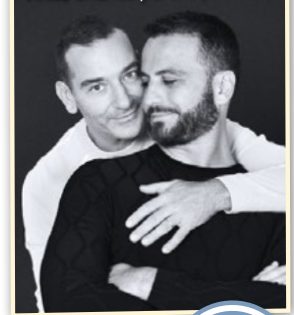
We've all been drawn to someone who looks great on the outside, only to find that they lack the depth or compatibility we need.
